At long last, construction begins this month on our long-awaited and long-laboredover accessibility project.

We will be seeing and experiencing this soon. Thanks to all of you, with contributions large and small over the last 10 years, we have the means to complete the first phase of the project. This includes the installation of a vertical lift inside the courtyard entrance, and the removal and reorientation of the stairways currently there.

It's gonna be messy, inconvenient, and disruptive for a while.

This marks a major step in our collective mission to be "a public space for the common good," and "to share God's love with our neighbors." All neighbors, especially those living on the margins in our world.

I think today of Bob Murphy. Years ago, unsteady on his feet, he took a tumble down the stairs carrying Sue's casserole for potluck. I heard it from the kitchen and rushed to find him on his back with the casserole, unspilled, in both hands on his chest. He was proud to have saved the dish! Amazingly he was not seriously hurt. But I was seriously moved, and doubly motivated to make an elevator reality.

I think of Isabella, Diane Olin's granddaughter, who long ago at about 10 years old, gave me a five dollar bill from her savings toward the Accessibility Fund. I have her beautiful handwritten note on my shelf.

I think of Rod Amundson's granddaughter OE. It saddened him that she could not come to church with him because her motorized wheelchair was too heavy to lift up the stairs. Rod was an early champion of making Zion accessible.

Most of all, I am thankful to all of you! Your love and work has made Zion Community Commons a place that is life-giving and open to all.


This program fed over 430 people in October.
