2ION LUTHERAN CHURCH 1697 LAFOND AVE ST PAUL MN 55104 The Advent/Christmas season has begun. Traditionally it begins with a call to awaken. As the Advent hymn declares: "Awake, Awake and Greet the New Morn"--ELW 242. To what are we to awake? How? To what end? This is the season of incarnation, of God embodied in Christ and in us, Christ's body. In a world full of darkness, to be and bear light. Here is a reflection written for the first week in Advent. I think it relevant to our time.

When our daughter Charlie was little she would awake early, come into our bedroom, and if we were sleeping--or pretending to be--call out, "Wake up the eyes!"

Wake up the eyes.

Such a beautiful invitation. Sometimes accompanied with a startling hand slap on the mattress. It was impossible not to smile, even if we wanted more sleep. It was time to wake up.

It is common experience to live in an unawakened state, to remain asleep, even as we get up and go about our business (busy-ness) each day--habitually reacting, rather than being fully awake and alive.

The invitation is to wake up the eyes--of our hearts. To practice presence in the midst of everything that makes us want to close and harden our hearts. It is not complicated. Not hard to understand.

Try this. See if you can locate your fear or apprehension right now. What is it? What's it about? Maybe it is quite personal. You feel overwhelmed, inadequate, unprepared, unsafe, failing, disorganized, lonely, unloved or unlovable. These are unpleasant feelings we all experience from time to time. We don't like them and try to avoid or overcome them in some way.

Or maybe our fears are about the state of the world. A sense of outrage or doom.

What does it mean to awaken the eyes of the heart? There is truth in all these experiences, especially the most disturbing and distressing.

Yeshua, according to Matthew (24-25), warned his students about dark days ahead, full of destruction, betrayal, falsehood (even in his name), violence, and terror. It was accurate. *Is* accurate.

"Don't be led astray...Because of the growing lawlessness the love of many will grow cold. But those who endure to the end are saved." he said.

He offers no solutions, no happy ending, and no escape from any of this painful experience. What he clarifies is that it is all about love. Love gone cold, or love that keeps loving.

"Keep awake," Yeshua tells them, "to the end." Clearly this awakeness is indestructible love, the heart of all that matters.

The final analysis, often pictured poetically as a final judgement, is then pictured by Yeshua this way: All humanity is gathered. People are judged simply on whether they "welcomed the stranger/alien, fed the hungry, clothed the naked, cared for the sick, and visited the prisoner"--or did not.

Remarkably, those who showed compassion had no expectation or thought of reward. Instead, they were simply there for one another, saw value in--and identified with--their lowliest neighbors, and acted accordingly. With love.



To love does not *lead to or merit* salvation, it *is* salvation. When we surrender to love we surrender to truth and find life. Right here, right now, no matter what. We get up, we engage, we face the moment, and we do not lose heart, for Love continually wakes us from slumber calling, "Wake up the eyes!"

The **Shank-Hagedorn duo** has been performing all over the US, with concerts in CO, MN, WI, IN, OR, CA and Mexico. They have recorded two CDs on the innova and Centaur labels.

Joe Hagedorn earned a BM degree from Cornell College and a MM degree from the U of M. He has served on the music faculty of the University of Wisconsin-River Falls since 1988, and his solo and concerto appearances have taken him to more than 25 American cities and Canada. A founding member of the Minneapolis Guitar Quartet, Joe performed with the group from 1986 until 2023, touring extensively throughout the US and the world. In 1990, he was the first prize winner at the Guitar Foundation of America International solo competition.



Leslie Shank was a member of The SPCO for 30 years, 24 of them as assistant concertmaster. She has performed at leading festivals, including Aspen, Grand Teton, Mainly Mozart, and Marlboro. Shank earned both Bachelor's and Master's degrees from The Juilliard School. Ms. Shank is a founding member of the Isles Ensemble, composed of many of the Twin Cities' foremost chamber musicians; she plays both violin and viola in the group.

Maja Radovanlija is a versatile guitarist and musical explorer. Born in Belgrade, Yugoslavia, she brings nearly two decades of classical guitar training from University of Belgrade and Jacobs School of Music, where she earned her MM and DM degrees. Her musical path has been defined by a rich tapestry of collaborations that traverse diverse genres, from Balkan traditional music to Early music, jazz, and intuitive free improvisation. Radovanlija is an active member of multiple distinguished ensembles. Her innovative approach to music-making reflects a deep commitment to cross-cultural musical dialogue and creative expression.

Brent Weaver has a Bachelor of Arts degree in music from California State University, Sacramento. In 1996, Brent received his Master of Music in Music Education degree with a Kodaly emphasis from Holy Names College in Oakland, California. Soon after, he moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota where he taught for 24 years at MacPhail Center for Music. Currently he teaches traditional classical and Suzuki guitar at the Midway Guitar Studio in St Paul. Brent has studied with Jose Rey de la Torre, John Majors and Jim Flegel. He has appeared in master classes with many distinguished artists most recently with Eduardo Fernandez, Carlos Perez and Alieksey Vianna.

Xavier Jara is an American guitarist of international acclaim. In 2016, he won the coveted First Prize of the Guitar Foundation of America International Concert Artist Competition, which awarded him a sixty-concert tour. The tour covered North and South America, including a concert at Carnegie Hall.

A native of Minnesota, Xavier studied with Alan Johnston at the MacPhail Center for Music in Minneapolis until 2011, when he moved to Paris, France, completing his Bachelor's Degree at the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique de Paris. He received 1st place in a number of international competitions including the Viseu International Competition (2014), the Boston Guitarfest (2014), the Gargnano, Italy Competition (2015), the Ciudad de Coria Competition (2015), and the Tokyo International Competition (2016).

In 2016, Xavier returned home to the United States to win the GFA's prestigious Rose Augustine Grand Prize, and in 2020, Xavier earned his MM from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He continues to perform around the world and joined the United States Guitar Orchestra as a soloist in 2022 on their tour of Spain. As a teacher, he previously served as the Adjunct Professor of Guitar at California State University Fullerton, and recently taught the Spring 2022 semester at the University of Louisville, conducting and performing in Javier Farías's Arauco with the U of L guitar ensemble.


